



## Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody Recommendation

### 67. Research program to monitor consequences of alcohol use

*That the National Drug Abuse Data System of the NCADA institute a regular research program to establish baseline data and monitor changes over time in relation to the health, social and economic consequences of alcohol use among Aboriginal people.<sup>1</sup>*

<b>Background<sup>2</sup></b>	The Royal Commission into Aboriginal Deaths in Custody (RCIADIC) emphasised the lack of data on the economic impact of alcohol use and the levels of expenditure on alcoholic beverages. It noted that while Aboriginal people bear the social and health costs of alcohol misuse, they do not share in the economic benefits of the alcohol industry. The Commission also emphasised the culturally specific harms of alcohol in Aboriginal communities, including its role in disrupting ceremonies and contributing to family and community breakdown. The RCIADIC recommended a dedicated research program to track these impacts over time and inform more effective, culturally appropriate responses.
<b>Intent</b>	Establish a research program that monitors the changes over time, in relation to the economic, social and health impacts of alcohol on Aboriginal people.
<b>Responsibility</b>	The Commonwealth Government.

<b>Key action taken</b>	
<b>2005 Review<sup>3</sup></b>	<p>The Victorian Government considered Recommendation 67 to be the sole responsibility of the Commonwealth Government.</p> <p><b>Review Team</b></p> <p>The Review Team agreed that Recommendation 67 was primarily aimed at the national level, however, such data was also considered vital at a state level. The Review Team considered that Recommendation 67 was relevant to Victoria.</p>
<b>2018 Review<sup>4</sup></b>	Deloitte considered Recommendation 67 the sole responsibility of the Commonwealth Government. Whilst the NCADA has been discontinued, Deloitte concluded that the Commonwealth Government had <b>fully implemented</b> this recommendation by continuing the

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	collection and publication of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health surveys through the Australian Bureau of Statistics.
Since then	<b>Department of Health<sup>5</sup></b> In their 2025 response, the Department of Health deemed this recommendation a Commonwealth responsibility and considered it fully implemented. They noted that the department has not commissioned any comprehensive alcohol related research in relation to Aboriginal cohorts in Victoria.
